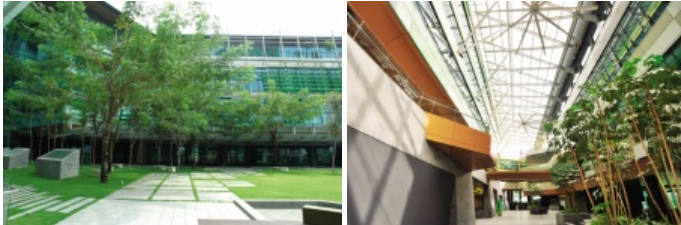


MRCB's "green" efforts recognised
