COMPETITION

For the past 2 years PAM has successfully organised a series of competitions on Master Planning and Architectural design; from PAM Education Fund's 3 Stonor Competition to the recently concluded PAM NAZA TTDI Bertam Master Planning.

All in, there are more than 8 competitions. This was part of an effort to realize the aspirations of the Malaysian Architecture Policy (MAP) and to provide more opportunities for the discovery of Malaysian architectural talents.

Without doubt, an architectural competition is the best awareness for our architectural talents to be recognised. It also makes procurement transparent as long as the competitions are run by reputable entities such as PAM.

All these competitions are conducted based on the PAM Competition guidelines which is designed based on the UIA Guide for International Competitions in Architecture and Town Planning UNESCO Regulations Term of Application.

Organising 8 competitions within a period of 2 years is a record of sorts, as the last PAM organised competition was held in 2003.

Questions have been asked whether PAM is running too many competitions and whether the actual intentions of having architectural competitions are achieved.

Some participants and winners have also enquired on the way the competitions have been conducted.

In view of this, a committee has been set up to review the PAM Competition Guideline. This committee is headed by Past President on Council, Ar. David Teh. The committee invited PAM members to submit their views to the PAM Competitions and Review Committee. The response from members have been encouraging. It is hoped that the committee can conclude its finding and make its recommendation to PAM Council by early 2012. Meanwhile the competitions continue with the soon to be announced 1MDB Signature Tower Competition and much awaited Tanduk Project Competition.

COURTESY VISIT TO CIDB 1 DECEMBER 2011

The courtesy visit to CIBD was attended by Ar Saifuddin Ahmad, Ar Mohd Zulhemlee An, Ar Ezumi Harzani and Ar Paul Lai Chu.

The meeting was chaired by Dato' Sri Ir Dr Judin Abdul Karim, CIDB Chief Executive. Other representatives were Ir Elias, Pn Sariah, Ir Ahmad Asri and En Sazali.

The issues discussed are as follows:

1. Clerk-of-Works

PAM expressed our view that a proper training centre needed to be set-up for architecture Clerk-of-Works. PAM offered to conduct the training courses with the support from CIDB in terms of facilities and venue.

CIDB is willing to support PAM's intention. However, the course structure needed to be reviewed to be a business model. CIDB also would like the structure to have linkages with the industries where there are jobs available for the trainee after completion of the course. CIDB agreed to form a working group with PAM and BEM / ACEM to review the course structure.

2. Building Information Modelling (BIM) Training Program

PAM asked for CIDB's assistance to obtain funding from the government for BIM training program. CIDB informed that the government is pushing for the implementation of this training program. Currently PEMANDU is requesting the funding from the government. CIDB said that if CIDB runs the training, they will offer "pay per use" basis which the users will only pay when they use the software on their jobs.

CIDB suggested that the BIM software has to be multiple platforms or any platform as decided by the industry partner. Currently, CIDB is open to any software provider to offer any module and packages suitable to be used by the industry partners. CIDB agreed to work together with PAM to look into the best service providers. CIDB also hoped that PAM could establish a training program that have linkages with the industries where there are jobs available for the trainee after completing the training.

3. Industrialised Building System (IBS) Implementation PAM proposed to CIDB to organise a design competition for buildings using IBS solution, e.g. standard affordable housing design. CIDB agreed to the proposal and will form a working group and invite RISM and ACEM to be involved. CIDB will need PAM to assist in promoting the competition and winners in any PAM's publications.

4. Green Labelling

PAM raised concern on the prolonged time taken by SIRIM to publish the Green Labelling standard. PAM urged CIDB's assistance to follow-up with SIRIM as Green Building Index (GBI) has been introduced since May 2009. The Green Labelling standard is the only missing link as now we rely on standards by other countries.



5. Green PASS

PAM hoped that the content of the Construction Industry Standard (CIS) on Green Performance Assessment System in Construction (Green PASS) constructed by CIDB is not a duplicate of the Green Building Index that has been developed by PAM. This is to avoid confusion amongst the public. CIDB informed that the standard is meant for government projects only.

6. Other matters

a) Composition of CIDB Board

PAM would like to get clarification on the composition of the CIDB Board. CIDB explained that currently there are four appointed from government and seven from private which includes REHDA, Persatuan Kontraktor Bumiputera Malaysia, MBAM which total up to 11 members. PAM asked CIDB to increase the number of committee members and considering PAM to be invited as a Board member. CIDB informed that the Minister of Woks is the one who decides on the composition of Board members and he would decide if the current Act needs to be changed to increase the number of Board members.

b) Enforcement of CIDB Act

PAM expressed hope that CIDB will be stricter on enforcing the CIDB Act to the contractors, e.g. on Green Card. CIDB informed that under the new CIDB Act, CIDB will have more authority to take action against the contractors. CIDB hoped that PAM will support CIDB's effort by making announcement in PAM's publications if anyone found guilty of breaching the CIDB Act.

c) Registration of Project Managers

PAM enquired CIDB on how to control the Project Managers as they are not liable equally as the Principal Submitting Person (PSP). CIDB proposed that the Project Managers to be registered with CIDB. CIDB will work with other boards on how to move forward on this.

COURTESY VISIT TO THE MINISTER OF HOUSING AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

5 DECEMBER 2011

The courtesy visit to the Ministry of Housing and Local Government (MOHLG) was attended by Ar Saifuddin Ahmad, Ar Tan Pei Ing, Ar Ezumi Harzani Ismail, Ar S. Thirilogachandran and Ar Steven Thang Boon Ann.

The meeting was chaired by YB Datuk Seri Chor Chee Heung, Minister of Housing and Local Government. Other representatives were En Mohamad Yusoff Bin Ghazali, Mr Tan Lai Seng and Ms Esther.

The issues discussed are as follows:

1. Implementation of OSC and CCC system

Datuk Seri informed that the Ministry received complaints from the house buyers on the houses built not up to their level of expectations. Datuk Seri asked PAM to send reminder to their members to be more careful in issuing CCC and stages certification to prevent the above from repeating and to avoid abandonment of projects.

PAM informed Datuk Seri about the inconsistencies of practice by local authorities on OSC and CCC system, some of which include creating their own forms and requirements customised 4. Amendment to the Town and Country Planning Act 1976 from the standard template issued by MOHLG. This customisation by local authorities is inconsistent and creates confusion to the users (public and submitting persons). Datuk Seri asked PAM to give examples on these local authorities. PAM named Majlis Perbandaran Klang, Majlis Perbandaran Sepang and Majlis Perbandaran Kajang.

PAM expressed hope that the Ministry will closely monitor the performances of local authorities to ensure improvement in the public delivery system and subsequently will attract investors to Malaysia. Datuk Seri said that the Ministry (under the Jabatan Kerajaan Tempatan) is always trying to do their best on this matter.

2. Housing Policy

PAM raised its concern on the PR1MA affordable housing policy set-up by PEMANDU which PAM worries that the irresponsible developers will take opportunities to convert the low cost housing developments to affordable housing developments by rebranding under PR1MA scheme. The Minister explained that such thing will never happen because only registered developers under PR1MA will be given permission to do developments. The developers must follow the criteria that have been set by the PR1MA committee. The Minister said that he will voice PAM's concern to the PR1MA committee.

PAM offered to organise competitions for buildings, e.g. design competitions, design construction competitions and usage of IBS in design competitions. The competitions could be in collaboration with others like CIDB and ACEM. The Minister agreed to the proposal.

3. Planning Submission Issue

PAM informed Datuk Seri that the Chief Secretary of MOHLG has made decision with regards to the submission for planning approval issue. The decision made was that the matter will remain as status quo, i.e. to follow the current Acts.



Following to that decision, the Chief Secretary has issued a directive to all State Secretary for them to inform local authorities under their jurisdiction accordingly. However, it seems that not many local authorities are aware of the directive. Therefore, PAM informed Datuk Seri that PAM will be writing to all State Secretary to inform the local authorities about the directive and to ask them to follow the directive.

(Act 172)

PAM raised concern on the proposed amendments to the Town and Country Planning Act 1976 (Act 172) which PAM is of the view that those proposed amendments would give more power to the State Planners (Pengarah Perancang Negeri). PAM informed that every Act should protect the public safety and health, not protecting a certain group of people only. PAM is of the view that other professions' concerns must also be taken into considerations when amendments are to be made. PAM informed Datuk Seri that PEJUTA and UiTM have submitted their objections on the proposed amendments.

PAM also highlighted that the professionals must allow freedom to the public for them to choose which professionals they want to engage either Architect, Planner etc.

5. Building Plan Approval

PAM expressed hope that the checking process for building plan approval will be simplified.

PAM also brought up the issue on the penalty charged by some local authorities on the amendment to the approved plan, i.e. ten times of the amendment fees which actually should be charged only RM60. PAM informed that the local authorities misunderstood the clause with another clause for penalty charge for commencement of work before approval of plan. Datuk Seri informed that he is not aware of such practice by local authorities. He will forward this issue to JKT for their further action.


6. Other matters


a) Landscape Act

PAM expressed concern on the public safety and health as some of landscaping works may involve hardscape and building structure and these have to be submitted by qualified person.


COUNTDOWN CLOCK 2020 WINNERS' PROJECTS

PROFESSIONAL CATEGORY






